Historic Information: Contributing. Circa 1930 two story Italian Renaissance beige brick house with a spreading green tile roof, upper stories incorporated into a wide frieze-like band, and pronounced round head windows with blind arcades. The rather grand house culminates in a handsome entrance portico with a segmental pediment and Tuscan columns. A richly articulated one story sunroom with a balustrade at the top is found on each side of the façade. (This is perhaps Drehr Place's most impressive architectural landmark.)

Historic Information: Contributing. This 1930s eclectic, two-story, brick, L-shaped residence has an overall Mediterranean character with some of its façade window treatments being more specifically Spanish Colonial Revival. Below an upper story porch is a triple arch window. A double arch window with multiple panes of glass encompasses most of the front-facing two story gable. Both sets of arched windows feature decoratively turned wooden pilasters. The large window in the gable also has small turned members in the tops of the arches. Portions of the roof visible from the street are sheathed in tile. A tile coping accents the remainder of the roof.
