Below an upper story porch is a triple arch window. A double arch window with multiple panes of glass encompasses most of the front-facing two story gable. Both sets of arched windows feature decoratively turned wooden pilasters. The large window in the gable also has small turned members in the tops of the arches. Portions of the roof visible from the street are sheathed in tile. A tile coping accents the remainder of the roof.
